BSG PLANT COURSES ARE NOW BEING DELIVERED BY ACCREDITED NPORS TRAINERS

We are very pleased to announce that from the 1st of October 2018, members can receive NPORS accredited training organised by BSG on all plant courses.

WHAT IS NPORS?

Established in 1992, the National Plant Operators Registration Scheme (NPORS) is now one of the UK's leading Accreditation and Registration Bodies, working across the Construction, Industrial, Utilities, Warehousing and Distribution, Agricultural, Ports and Marine sectors.

NPORS training and testing is conducted in accordance with published course objectives and learning outcomes which are derived from the National Occupational Standards. Testing includes Theory and Practical testing much in the same was as CPCS. It is possible to book a 1 day course for experienced operators that involves testing only. Alternatively, a novice or refresher course can be booked over several days to include training prior to testing.

CSCS NPORS CARDS

NPORS now offers a CSCS card. Much like the CPCS operator cards, this type of card will require you to complete practical and theory tests after which you will be awarded a two-year 'red' Trained Operator card. During the two year period, they will be required to register for and achieve the requisite (S)NVQ with the unit credits applicable to the category(s) of plant held on their Trained Operator card.

Once successfully tested, operators who do currently hold the requisite (S)NVQ with the unit credits applicable to the categories of plant held on their NPORS card will be issued with a 'blue' Competent Operator card valid for 5 years from the date they were tested.

Please note that in all cases operators will have to supply proof of having passed the CITB Health, Safety & Environmental touch screen test http://ntsservices.co.uk/health-safety-touch-screen-test/ within the two years prior to application for the card.



ARE NPORS CARDS ACCEPTED ON SITE?

NPORS cards are accepted on all construction sites. Most people in construction are familiar with the Construction Skills Certification Scheme (CSCS) cards. It's the card that provides proof that individuals working on construction sites have the appropriate training and qualifications for the job they do on site.

There are over 30 different card schemes displaying the CSCS logo and this can cause some confusion at the site gates. Card schemes displaying the CSCS logo are known as CSCS Partner Card schemes and they represent the many specialist occupations such as plant, demolition, plumbing and scaffolding.

Card schemes displaying the CSCS logo are based on the approved standards as mandated by the Construction Leadership Council and like the CSCS scheme require the holder to gain an N/SVQ and pass the CITB Health, Safety & Environmental test and are accepted when presented on site.

The NPORS card has a QR code that can be checked using a smartphone, alternatively, site managers can visit www.npors.com and use the online card checker or if all else fails they can contact NPORS on 01606 351240 if they wish to check if an NPORS card is valid.

WHICH NPORS ACCREDITED TRAINING CAN YOU RECEIVE?

- Chainsaw Crosscut Operations (1 day)
- Excavator (1 day dependent on experience)
- Harness safe use & inspection (half a day)
- Lorry loader (HIAB) (1 day dependent on experience)
- Mobile elevated working platform (MEWP) (1 day)
- Skid steer loader (bobcat) (1 day dependent on experience)
- Telehandler (1 day dependent on experience)
- <u>Dumper (1 day dependent on experience)</u>
- Forklift operator (1 day dependent on experience)
- Loading shovel (bucket loader) (1 day dependent on experience)
- <u>Mini digger (1 day dependent on experience)</u>
- <u>Overhead crane (1 day)</u>
- Slinger banksman (1 day)
- Vehicle banksman (half a day)

WHAT TO EXPECT ON THE DAY?

Employers, once they have assessed the suitability of a person for the role of plant operator will then decide which route their candidate should follow i.e. novice, operator, experienced operator requiring training or experienced operator requiring no training. An NPORS Accredited Training Provider (ATP) will complete a pre-assessment of the operator to determine the level of training required.

Novice

If you are a novice, training will be conducted in line with NPORS course objectives, learning outcomes and training ratios. A theoretical and practical test will then be undertaken.

The Theory Test


You will first undertake the theory section of the test. The theory test will be a written exam made up of 25 questions. The first 5 questions will require a full written answer, with the following 20 questions being multiple choice.


You will not be permitted access to any computer or mobile phone during the test. You will not receive any help or guidance during the test. (If you feel you may require help with your theory test, please consider booking refresher training in advance of the test).

Ideally, you would pass the theory test in order to progress to the practical test. If you fail the theory test you will be offered the opportunity to undertake the practical test but you would then have to retake the theory test at another time and would incur an additional charge for this.

Once you have successfully passed the Theory Test you will move onto the Practical Test. This will take place outside and will involve the tester providing you with instructions to follow out on the machinery. You will then be assessed to ensure you have the necessary experience, core skills and the technical knowledge to operate the specific category of plant safely.

Experienced operator

If you are an experienced operator you will be able to undertake a 1 day theory and practical test day without the need for training. These are the same tests that would take place at the end of one of our plant training courses.



At the end of the test day, you will be asked to complete a form providing your contact details.

If you successfully pass both the theory and practical elements of the test you will be awarded with an NPORS CSCS card which we will apply for on your behalf.

IS IT GRANT FUNDED BY CITB?

CITB pay grants for the achievement of approved plant training courses and qualifications.

The Plant training grants are paid out for the achievement of approved plant training courses, plant testing and qualifications which include:

- plant-related short duration course training
- the theory and practical elements of standard or advanced technical tests for approved plant card schemes.
- plant-related vocational qualification (VQ) achievements
- specific plant-related VQ units.

How to claim for plant short duration courses

The online system is not currently set up to action grant claims for NPORS training however, levy payers can still claim the grant via the manual system.

CSCS ANNOUNCE PRICE RISE

The Construction Skills Certification Scheme (CSCS) increased the

cost of a card to £36 (this includes VAT) on the 1st of September 2018. This increase applies to all cards administered directly by CSCS.

CSCS is the leading



skills certification scheme within the UK construction industry. A CSCS card provides proof that individuals

working on construction sites have the required training and qualifications for the type of work they carry out.

The last price increase occurred in 2010 but since then the costs associated with running the scheme have increased significantly.

Graham Wren, CSCS Chief Executive said: "We have managed to maintain the current card price for the last eight years however inflationary pressure, together with increased costs associated with combatting fraudulent activity, have pushed our costs up to the point where the current price is not sustainable. In addition, with our current contact centre provider CITB having served notice to exit the service contract the CSCS Board have agreed to invest in new technology and systems to ensure the application process is modernised."

Graham Wren continued: "Modernising the application process is a key priority for the CSCS Board and the additional investment will ensure the card continues to add value and play its part in improving standards and safety on UK construction sites."

OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH: FACTS AND FIGURES

lll health

HSE estimates that there are 1.2 million cases of ill health annually, caused or made worse by work, with 22.3 million working days lost due to work-related illness.

Stress, depression or anxiety and musculoskeletal disorders accounted for the majority of days lost due to workrelated ill health, 9.9 and 9.5 million days respectively.



Around 80% of new work-related conditions were either musculoskeletal disorders, stress, depression or anxiety.

Cost

27.3 million working days are lost annually due to work-related injury and illness. The cost to British employers of health and safety failure was estimated to be £2.8 billion in 2013/14.

Penalties

Those found guilty in a magistrate's court of health and safety offences can face fines of up to £20,000 and/or up to 12 months imprisonment. Conviction in a Crown Court can result in an unlimited fine and/or a period of imprisonment of up to two years.

CSCS NEW SMART TECH MICROSITE LAUNCHED

CSCS has launched a new website all about the CSCS Go Smart app. Go Smart reads CSCS cards electronically and records card details automatically. This can save your site time and money.

WHAT IS GO SMART?

Go Smart is the construction industry app for reading CSCS cards electronically. It can be used both online and offiine allowing you to check cards even when you have no connectivity.



Go Smart can also be used to read cards issued by many of CSCS's Partner Card schemes.

GO SMART IS AVAILABLE FOR:

Android smartphones and tablets

PCs and laptops

iPhones and iPads - Go Smart for Apple can currently only be used to read virtual smartcards or Partner Cards which have a QR code. This is due to restrictions imposed by Apple on using NFC on Apple devices.

WHY USE GO SMART?

By using Go Smart you access the most up-to-date information in real-time to validate the identity and qualifications of a cardholder, making it easy to identify "fake" and expired cards, improving health and safety in construction for all.

A quick and simple card read enables you to:

- Check for updates since the card was issued;
- · Check that the card is valid;
- Check that cardholders have the required training and qualifications for the type of work they are doing;
- Record that a card has been checked, with the time and location, where available;
- Capture cardholder information, avoiding the need to keep paper records.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Go Smart reads the information stored on the CSCS card which includes the card holder's identification and the qualifications they hold. This information is displayed on your smartphone, tablet, PC or laptop. This not only reduces the possibility of card fraud but also makes capturing and storing the information on the cards much quicker and more efficient.

For smartcards

Go Smart reads the information stored on smartcards issued by CSCS and many Partner Card Schemes by reading the chip embedded in the card.

If the device that Go Smart is installed on is not connected to the internet, Go Smart simply reads the data stored in the card chip and presents it on screen.

If the device is connected to the internet, Go Smart also checks to see if the card has been cancelled, suspended or updated. Go Smart then updates the data in the card chip, before displaying the cardholder's details on screen.

For virtual smartcards

Go Smart also reads virtual cards issued by some Partner Card Schemes by using encrypted, short-life QR codes.

Virtual smartcards are cards stored on a smartphone or tablet in an app called Vircarda and can be installed on Android, iOS and Windows Phone mobile devices.

If the device that Go Smart is installed on is not connected to the internet, Go Smart reads the basic information about the card, records the card and then runs a complete check once the device connects to the internet.

If the device is connected to the internet, Go Smart will download a copy of the card along with the time and GPS co-ordinates of the card read, where available. This provides a complete audit trail of card reads and sends a notification to the cardholder, if they have notifications switched on, on their smartphone or tablet.

CONSTRUCTION FIRM AND DIRECTOR FINED FOR SAFETY BREACHES

A company and its director have been fined for failure to comply with a prohibition and improvement notice.

Southwark Crown Court heard how, on 31 March 2016, Awad (UK) Ltd, under the control of its director Andrzej Wilk, was issued with a prohibition notice on site where it was found that persons were at serious risk of fall and injury from the unprotected edges at the site. The court also heard that the company was issued with an improvement notice on 4 April 2016 for failure to provide adequate and suitable welfare facilities at the site.

An investigation by the Health and Safety Executive (HSE) found Awad (UK) Ltd and Andrzej Wilk had not taken steps to comply with the prohibition notice preventing any work near the open edges where there was a risk of fall and injury to persons. The investigation also found that Awad (UK) Ltd and Andrzej Wilk had not complied with the improvement notice requiring the provision of adequate and sufficient welfare facilities.

Awad (UK) Ltd of Fourth Way, Wembley, Middlesex pleaded guilty to breaching Regulation 6(3) of the Work at Height Regulations 2005 and Section 21 and 22 of the Health & Safety at Work etc Act 1974. The company has been fined £37,500 and ordered to pay costs of £10,000.

Andrzej Wilk of Beresford Avenue, Surbiton pleaded guilty to breaching Section 37 of the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974 ands was fined £7,500 and ordered to pay costs of $\pm 10,000$.

COMPANY FINED FOR FAILING TO UNDERTAKE ASBESTOS ASSESSMENT

A property management company has today been sentenced after failing to carry out an asbestos survey prior to undertaking extensive refurbishment works.

Huntingdon Magistrates' Court heard how, between April and May 2017, Thistlemoor Healthcare and Management Ltd undertook construction work at two properties, one of which was part of a medical centre in Peterborough. In this time, the company failed to carry out an asbestos survey for either property, both of which were likely to contain asbestos.

An investigation by the Health and Safety Executive (HSE) found the company undertook and carried out construction which was likely to disturb asbestos containing materials during the strip out and part demolition of the two properties. Despite this, the company failed in its duty to carry out an asbestos survey for either property.

Thistlemoor Healthcare and Management Ltd of Thistlemoor Road, Peterborough pleaded guilty to breaching Regulation 5 of Control of Asbestos Regulations 2012 and has been fined £15,000 and ordered to pay costs of £1,805.60.

Speaking after the hearing, HSE inspector Samantha Wells said: "The risk of exposure to asbestos could so easily have been avoided if the company had carried out a suitable and sufficient asbestos assessment to identify the presence of asbestos within properties prior to commencing refurbishment work.

"Companies should be aware HSE will not hesitate to take appropriate enforcement action against those that fall below the required standards."
