Mini Digger Training

This course qualifies you to operate mini diggers on any site in the UK with permission of the person responsible for site H&S. Operate mini diggers within the category of mini digger for which you receive training. Use any attachment for which you receive training. It does not qualify you to instruct others in the use of a mini digger or supervise anyone who has not received formal training and qualification in the use of a mini digger.

Candidates per course

Maximum of 3 delegates per day.

Course duration

Course duration is dependent upon delegate numbers and experience. There is no minimum number of delegates required for training to commence.

Novice	<p>Less than 6 months operating experience</p> <p>2-5 day course (1 delegate: 1 instructor)</p> <p>4-8 day course (2 delegates: 1 instructor)</p> <p>5-10 day course (3 delegates: 1 instructor)</p>
Experienced	<p>More than 6 months regular operating experience</p> <p>1-2 day course (1-2 delegates: 1 instructor)</p> <p>2-3 day course (3 delegates: 1 instructor)</p>
Refresher	<p>Successfully completed formal training in the last 5 years</p> <p>1 day course (1-3 delegates: 1 instructor)</p>
Conversion	<p>From one truck type to another</p> <p>2 day course (1-3 delegates: 1 instructor)</p>

Minimum PPE (Personal Protective Equipment)

Safety Footwear	All delegates must wear safety footwear for the duration of practical training. Delegates will not be allowed to participate in training without safety footwear.
Hi vis, hard hat	Must be available for the practical training and assessment.



Equipment requirements

The client is responsible for supplying all equipment & PPE.

Mini Digger In good, serviceable condition. Manufacturer's instructions should be made available for training.

Land for excavation The practical training area must have an area of land that is suitable for excavation. Training cannot proceed without. The area of land must be appropriate for the objectives of the training.

Attachments Any additional attachments for which you require training can be included. Please notify BSG's Training Department of any such requirements prior to training.

Practical Training area For all vehicle based operator/instructor training, a suitable manoeuvring area should be provided. As a rule of thumb, this area should be large enough that the vehicle used for training can comfortably perform a figure of 8 manoeuvre as a minimum.

While training is in progress, access to this area should be restricted to the instructor and trainees. Where practicable, training areas should be sheltered from adverse weather conditions.

Office/ Classroom/ Cabin A well-lit and suitable heated closed door environment to conduct theory training. Tables and chairs to accommodate all delegates and the trainer assessor, this must include writing space for all delegates. A screen or projector is desirable but not essential.

Exclusive use of this facility is required for between 60-120 mins on the morning of each training day.
